A message from Mrs Davies to all our families....

The week started with some additional pupils in our Reception class! We welcomed our chicks which hatched over the weekend. Our children in Reception, along with Mr Shipton, Mrs Edwards and Mrs Morris have nutured an cared for the eggs which hatched over the weekend and are growing and chirping away in the Reception classroom. The children were delighted to come in and meet their furry friends and lots of classes have visited them this week. Thank you to Mrs Morris for bringing the eggs to school and all of the equipment needed to support our children experiencing the arrival of new life!



Our appreciation of Science continued this week. The children do really enjoy their Science lessons and everything they learn in their lessons. They are keen to further their learning through reading and researching. Some children brought in some equipment this week to share with their classes. Oscar brought a centrifuge into school and explained, to our Year 6 children, the components of blood and how these are separated. Edward brought in models of the heart which the class took apart and enjoyed exploring. Thank you to parents for taking the time to allow the children to do this; it is appreciated. Parents will be able to see children's wonderful Science work, next week, at parents' evening.





On Wednesday, we invited Anna, from Mary's Meals to our school. Mary's Meals is a Global feeding charity, feeding at least 2.6 million children all over the World. She spoke to the children about the great work that they do, as a charity, and how 10 pence will pay for a meal for a child. She shared that it costs £19.56 to feed a child for a year. The children (and staff) listened intently to everything Anna had to say and I know conversations continued in the classroom about how we could show solidarity by supporting the good work of Mary's Meals. One child approached Anna at the end of the assembly and asked if they could donate some pocket money they had to help feed children worldwide. As a result of this act, we have placed a feeding cup in

each classroom; and one in our school entrance, should anyone wish to make a donation. We have also decided to organise some events to raise money to support Mary's Meals—children helping to feed children is something to be proud of and I am proud of all of our children for the compassion they show to each other but to others beyond our school community. This is what we mean when we are committed to developing the whole child—Yes—reading, writing, maths are important, as is every curriculum area, but so is teaching our children to carry out the little acts of love and be a good person by treating others how they want to be treated; making the right choices—these are the important foundations all children need. Over the next few weeks, and during the summer term, our student councillors have asked that we work together, to raise what we can, to support this very worthy charity. Anna was very complimentary of the children and school and she wrote to me on Thursday to thank me for inviting her into school. She said.... 'Thank you for making me so welcome in your school yesterday, I had the most lovely time with you all. The children sang beautifully and their behaviour was impeccable.'
