

Forest School session— Thursday 18th Septem-

Thursday 25th September—Forest School Session for children in Year Two.



Linked to their learning in science, the Year 4 children learnt about different types of plants, focusing on the vocabulary of flowering plants, nonflowering plants, deciduous and evergreen trees. Using their data sheets, the children searched around the school grounds to identify different trees based on their characteristics. Once they had found lots of different types, they collected leaves and formed classification keys to sort each type of plant into different categories. Who knew we had so many different types of trees in our school grounds? Once the children had toasted their marshmallows, they focused on their history



topic—Ancient Greeks. With Miss Healey, the children have been looking at their lives and created a vo-vo which is linked to a toy that children would have used in Ancient Greek times. The children all practiced their sawing and drilling techniques and decorated their yo-yos in a similar style to an Ancient Greek shield. A wonderful session for everyone!
