Curriculum

All children follow the National Curriculum core subjects of Mathematics, English, Science & Computing, plus the Foundation subjects of History, Geography, Music, Art, Physical Education and Design Technology. Through Religious Education, the children are taught the Catholic/Christian faith, as well as other world religions. This is complemented by additional curricular areas such as Personal and Social Education, multi-cultural and environmental issues. French is taught from Year 3 to Year 6.

Curriculum Enrichment and Educational Visits



We take every opportunity to enrich the children's learning by taking them on educational visits or bringing guest speakers, theatre groups, musicians and other visitors into school.

Teachers aim to bring the curriculum to life by holding 'special' days, where children can immerse themselves into learning and have opportunity to experience new things first hand. These events are well organised and provide the children with 'hands on' experience including dressing up and practical tasks which enriches their learning opportunities.

In Key Stage Two, the children are given the opportunity of going on residential visits. In Year 4, this is a two night stay at a relatively local outdoor education centre in Delamere and in Year 6 the children enjoy a four night stay at Conway Outdoor Education on the Isle of Anglesey. We believe that these visits extend the children's experiences and learning beyond school and develop new skills, such as self-organisation.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The school endeavours to maintain a range of extra curricular activities, such as netball, basketball, athletics, football, gymnastics, tag-rugby, cross-country, dance, art, choir, nature, homework and Science club. We also have instrumental tuition through Tafel Musik on a fee-paying basis. We invite community sports clubs such as Learn Sport IV Life and Premier Sports into school to provide other sporting activities such as Judo, multi-skills, street dance, fencing or tennis.

Assessment

The progress of all pupils is carefully monitored and tracked throughout their time at St. Winefride's. Formal assessment of Years 2 and 6 pupils takes place in the Summer Term. Year 6 pupils sit Statutory Assessment Tests (SATS) in Reading, SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Mathematics and they are teacher assessed in Writing and Science; Year 2 pupils are graded using teacher assessment in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science. Reception children are assessed throughout their first year in school using the Foundation Stage Profile. All children are assessed termly by their class teacher.



The Children's Voice

We have an elected School Council which meets regularly to discuss issues involving school life. The councillors bring issues and concerns raised by their classmates.

Decisions, made by the School's Council, have positive effects on school life from the children's point of view.

We have Junior Road Safety Officers, who work with the Local Authority, to raise awareness about road safety amongst the pupils in our school.

Pastoral Care & Behaviour

We are aware that we share the responsibility with parents for the children in our care and so we make every effort to provide the care which a responsible parent would be expected to make. We control movement about the school, supervise the children while at play and encourage independence and self confidence.

We have a number of policies in place to ensure that staff and pupils remain safe whilst in school. There is a signing in and out system in place at the main entrance. Other doors are kept closed when appropriate. Fire drills are carried out each term and notices regarding evacuation procedures are displayed throughout school. All visitors to school are required to wear a 'visitor badge' upon entering our school.

Our school is a happy and friendly place, where children learn in a secure and caring community, The children are taught to have respect for themselves and the feelings of others. We encourage high standards of behaviour and good manners and we have effective rewards and sanction systems in place throughout the school.

Pupils with Special Educational Needs & Disabilities

St. Winefride's works with the Learning Support Service to provide teaching support to pupils with developmental learning, emotional, behavioural and physical difficulties. A child with special needs is assessed, monitored and his/her progress is recorded and reviewed regularly to ensure a co-ordinated approach in the best interests of the individual child. These needs are targeted through a termly learning goals (TLGs).

Parents are consulted at all times during this process. Class teachers discuss the child's needs with parents and the school's Special Needs Co-ordinator who is **Miss Holland**. Parental consent will be sought before any further action is taken. Liaison with parents is highly valued and essential for the children to make progress.

Child Protection/Safeguarding

Admissions...

Admission<mark>s</mark> to the School will be made by the Governing B</mark>ody and will be subject to the school's published **ADMISSION POLICY,** forming a priority order.

A copy of which is available on the school's website or from the school office.

Children are admitted into the Foundation Stage (Reception) in September of the year in which they have their fifth birthday. There is an induction period during the first few days of September, when children come to school in small groups to allow them time to settle in and feel secure ready for the full days in school.
